

UCSB DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC AWARDS, PRIZES, SCHOLARSHIPS

Registered undergraduate students are eligible for the following awards, prizes and scholarships. For further details contact the Department of Music.

SHERILL C. CORWIN–METROPOLITAN THEATRES AWARDS—

For excellence in music composition. Awarded annually to the undergraduate or graduate students judged to have submitted the most outstanding compositions in each of the following categories: orchestral work, work for wind ensemble, chamber work, electronic/electronic-acoustic work, and vocal work.

MUSIC AFFILIATES EXCELLENCE-AT-ENTRANCE PERFORMANCE AWARDS—

Awarded annually to outstanding entering undergraduate performance students (some renewable).

MUSIC AFFILIATES QUARTERLY PERFORMANCE AWARDS—

Awarded quarterly to an undergraduate performance student who has demonstrated outstanding achievement.

DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS/GRANTS-IN-AID—\$500-\$1500

Awarded annually to undergraduate and graduate music majors on the basis of musical and academic excellence, and financial need.

CARNZU A. CLARK SCHOLARSHIP—

Awarded when available to an exceptionally talented and accomplished undergraduate performance student at entrance. Renewable for up to four years.

ERNO DANIEL MEMORIAL AWARD IN PIANO-

Awarded annually to an outstanding piano major for distinguished performance.

EXCELLENCE IN ETHNOMUSICOLOGY AWARDS—Scholarly Activity, Creative Activity

Awarded annually to graduate and undergraduate students.

MAURICE FAULKNER BRASS QUINTET SCHOLARSHIPS—

Five prizes awarded to the members of the Maurice Faulkner Brass Quintet for excellence in performance.

MARTIN KAMEN FELLOWSHIPS (Piano, Strings) –

For excellence in string and piano performance at UCSB.

CARL ZYTOWSKI VOCAL SCHOLARSHIP-

Awarded annually to an outstanding vocal student.

OUTSTANDING GRADUATING SENIOR—

Awarded annually to the outstanding graduating senior, as determined by faculty vote.

OUTSTANDING SERVICE AWARD—

Awarded annually to the undergraduate or graduate student who has given the most outstanding service to the department, as determined by faculty vote.
